## SAILING INSTRUCTIONS for RCYC CLUB SAILING

## Effective from 01 July 2017 to 30 June 2018

The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the SI means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

#### 1. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The RCYC Club Sailing is organised by the Royal Cape Yacht Club.

#### 2. RULES

- **2.1** The races will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- **2.2** The following rules will also apply:
  - 2.2.1 IMS Rule
  - 2.2.2 ORC Rating Systems Rule
- 2.3 No national authority prescription will apply.
- **2.4** Racing Rule 52 is changed to allow powered winches, if this is declared and taken into account by the boat's handicap.
- **2.5** Racing Rule 52 is further changed during the Double Handed Series to also allow autopilots and self-steering equipment.

#### 3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to the competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the foyer of RCYC. They may also be posted on the club website.

## 4. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted not later than 09h00 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 20h00 on the day before it will take effect.

#### 5. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- **5.1** Signals made ashore will be displayed at the mast in front of the club up until the race committee has left the clubhouse for the starting hut, and thereafter at the starting hut on the harbour wall.
- **5.2** When flag AP is displayed ashore at the mast in front of the club '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 45 minutes' in the race signal AP.

#### 6. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- **6.1** The full schedule is detailed in Appendix A.
- **6.2** The races that comprise the Club Championships are detailed in Appendix B.

### 7. CLASS FLAGS

The Class flags will be:

Numeral Pennant No 2	Class B	Class A non-spinnaker

Numeral Pennant No 5	One Design Division Racing	Cruising & Catamaran (Texel Rating) Division

#### 8. RACING AREAS

The races will be sailed in and around Table Bay. The West Coast Offshore Race and the Mykonos Offshore Race will be sailed up the West Coast from Table Bay.

#### 9. THE COURSES

The courses may be posted on the club noticeboard up to 60 minutes before the scheduled start of a race. The courses will be announced at least 20 minutes before the start of any race on VHF Channel 06.

#### **10. MARKS**

The marks may be any of, or a combination of, harbour buoys, RCYC permanent marks and yellow, orange and red inflatable buoys. The approximate GPS positions of the harbour marks and RCYC permanent marks are available in Appendix C.

#### 11. THE START

- **11.1** Races will be started in the following Class order: Class A, Class B, Class C, Class D. The Warning signal of the following class will be displayed at the earliest at the starting signal for the previous class, and may also be given while other classes are still racing.
- **11.2** Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races. [DP]
- **11.3** Racing Rules A4 and A5 are changed so that a boat that does not start within ten minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing.
- **11.4** During the Twilight series a boat, which is late for the start, may motor after the preparatory signal provided that the boat completes a single penalty turn after switching off her motor and before starting.
- **11.5** After signalling an individual recall, the race committee will attempt to broadcast the sail number or name of the boat that has not started and is identified as OCS on VHF channel 06. Delay in the radio broadcast of these calls, or the order in which they are made, or any omission or failure in the emission or reception of these, will not be grounds for a request for redress by the boat. This changes RRS 60.1(b).

#### 12. THE FINISH

It is possible that when finishing, the race committee may not see or record your finish (owing to fog, poor light, or time limit having expired). In this case you can cross the finish

line and take your own time, report it to the bridge on VHF Channel 06, as well as other competitors still sailing. This time must also be handed in at the Sailing Office. You may be required to substantiate this with a GPS reading.

#### 13. **SHORTENING COURSE**

Races may also be shortened, by an announcement on the designated VHF channel, and the flying of the "S" flag at the Bridge Hut with the appropriate sound signal.

#### 14. TIME LIMITS

- **14.1** If in the opinion of the Race Officer the leading yacht in any race has not maintained or is not likely to attain an average speed of 2 knots, the race may be abandoned.
- **14.2** Although there is no time limit for a race the race committee may announce on VHF radio channel 06 that it will no longer man the finish line, and that boats still racing should take their own finish time. In that event a boat shall take her finish time when she crosses the finish line, forthwith broadcast her name and finish time on VHF channel 6, inform the race committee of her finish time and keep a record of her GPS track when finishing.
- **14.3** The bridge time limit for Twilight Racing is 20h00.
- **14.4** If more than one race is scheduled on the day, the Race Committee may impose a time limit. For each class the time will be the elapsed time of the first boat in her class that sails the course and finishes multiplied by 1.4 (Elapsed x 1. 4).

#### 15. DIVISIONS/CLASSES

#### **DOUBLE HANDED SERIES**

Division	ORC CDL rating
Class A	8,500 and higher
Class B	Lower than 8,500

Classes will have separate starts and separate results.

#### **16. PENALTY SYSTEMS**

**16.1** RRS 44.1 will be changed so that the penalty for a boat breaking a rule in Part 2 shall be a One-Turn Penalty (1 tack and 1 gybe) and not a Two-Turn.

#### 17. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- **17.1** In addition to complying with RRS 61, a protesting boat shall inform the Race Committee of her intention to protest and the identity of the protested boat(s) as soon as possible after finishing or retiring.
- **17.2** Protest forms are available at reception in the RCYC foyer. Protests shall be submitted within the protest time limit and handed in at the Sailing Office or Club Reception.
- **17.3** The protest time limit for each class is 90 minutes after the last boat of each class has finished the last race of the day.
- **17.4** Notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- **17.5** Notices of protests by the race committee will be conveyed, or posted, to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).
- **17.6** For the purpose of rule 64.3 (b) the 'authority responsible' is a measurer appointed by the organizing authority or if not appointed, a Measurer appointed by the Protest Committee.
- **17.7** In the case of twilight racing, the protest hearing will not be heard on the evening of the incident, a date will be set aside within seven days of the incident.

### 18. **SCORING**

- **18.1** Race results will be determined by corrected times using the ORC Coastal Time on Time number.
- **18.2** When four or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When five or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding the worst score. When seven or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding the two worst scores.
- **18.3** Boats without clearly displayed Sail Numbers will not be scored. [DP]
- **18.4** One Design Classes, including IRC, having more than 5 entries, will score a result.
- **18.5** For the Lufthansa Twilight Series, Non-Spinnaker divisions will be scored on ORC's Non Spin OSN ToT.

#### 19. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- **19.1** All skippers shall have valid skipper's certificates and proof of this shall be provided to the sailing office.
- 19.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible. [DP]
- **19.3** For the West Coast Overnight Race and the Mykonos Offshore Race, the rules of Part 2 of the RRS will cease to govern, and the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collision at Sea will apply.
- **19.4** No boat may participate in any race with an anchor positioned on the bow. The anchor should be stowed in the anchor locker or another locker or below decks

## 20. EVENT ADVERTISING

Boats shall display event advertising, if supplied, in the manner described by the organizing authority in a notice that will be issued by 18h00 the day before a race. If this rule is broken, World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies. [DP]

#### 21. RADIO COMMUNICATION

21.1 Radio communication with Race Committee during the regatta will be on VHF channel06. The Race Committee may give verbal confirmation of any race signal over VHF

Channel **06.** Failure to make a broadcast or to time it accurately will not not be grounds for request for redress by the boat. This changes RRS 60.1(b).

**21.2** Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This changes RRS 41. [DP]

### 22. **PRIZES**

Prizes will be awarded in each event and there will be medals for those boats that place first, second and third in each division for the Club Championships.

#### 23. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.


#### 24. INSURANCE


Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of R5 million.
